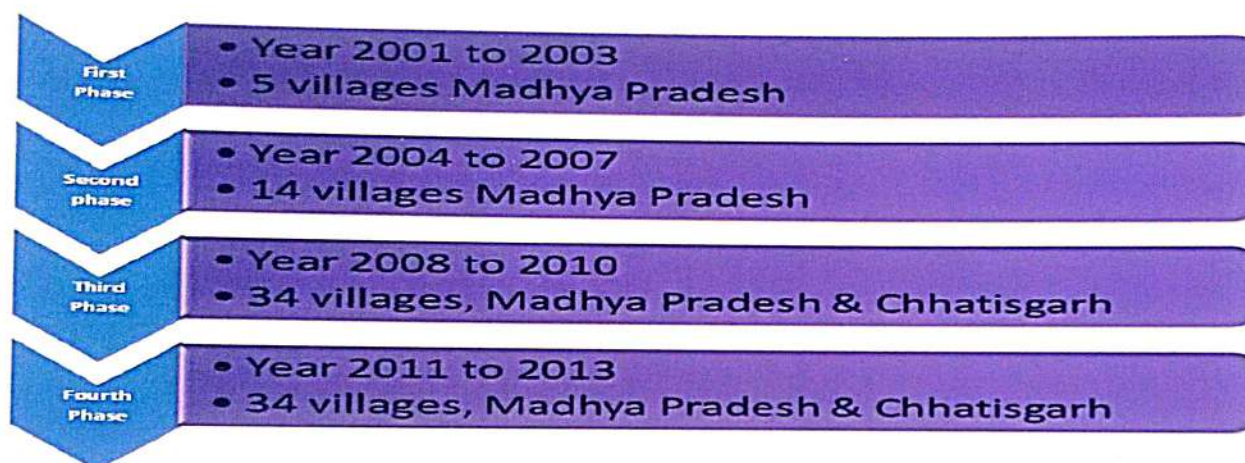

Phase Four	strengthening community based advocacy groups for tribal rights

	➤ Strengthening of village institutions towards sustainability
	➤ Strengthening of village volunteers network at district and state level.

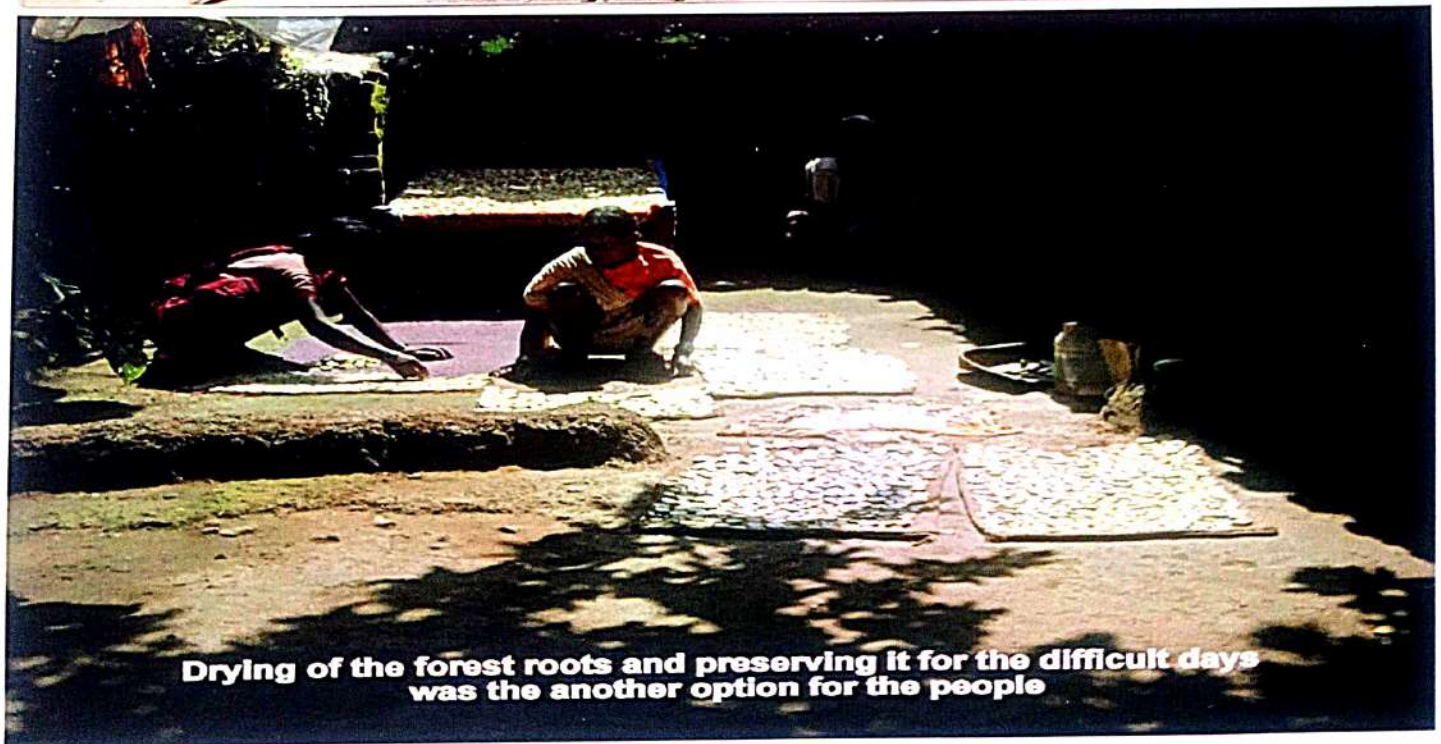


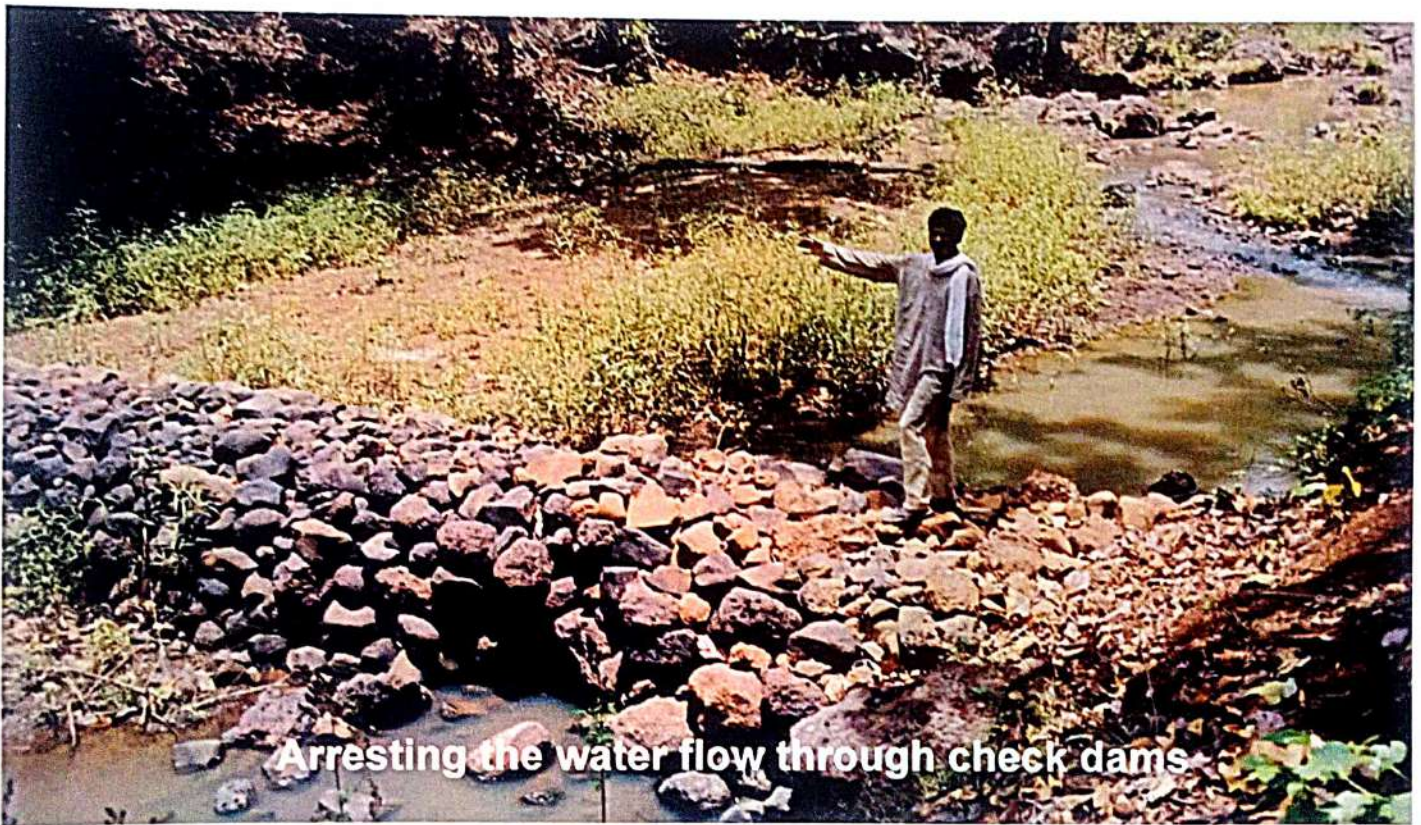

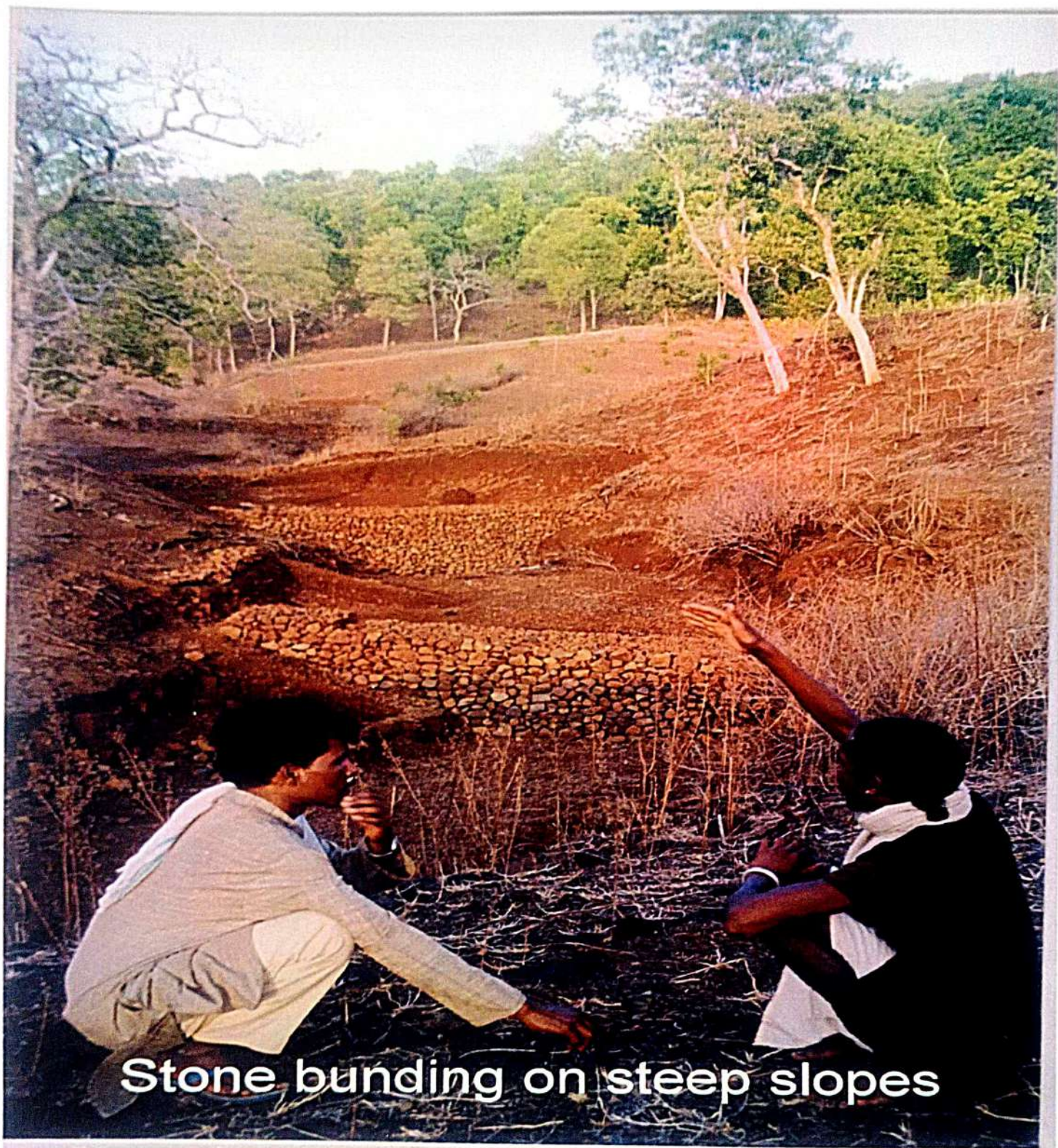


Land and Water structure Development Measures

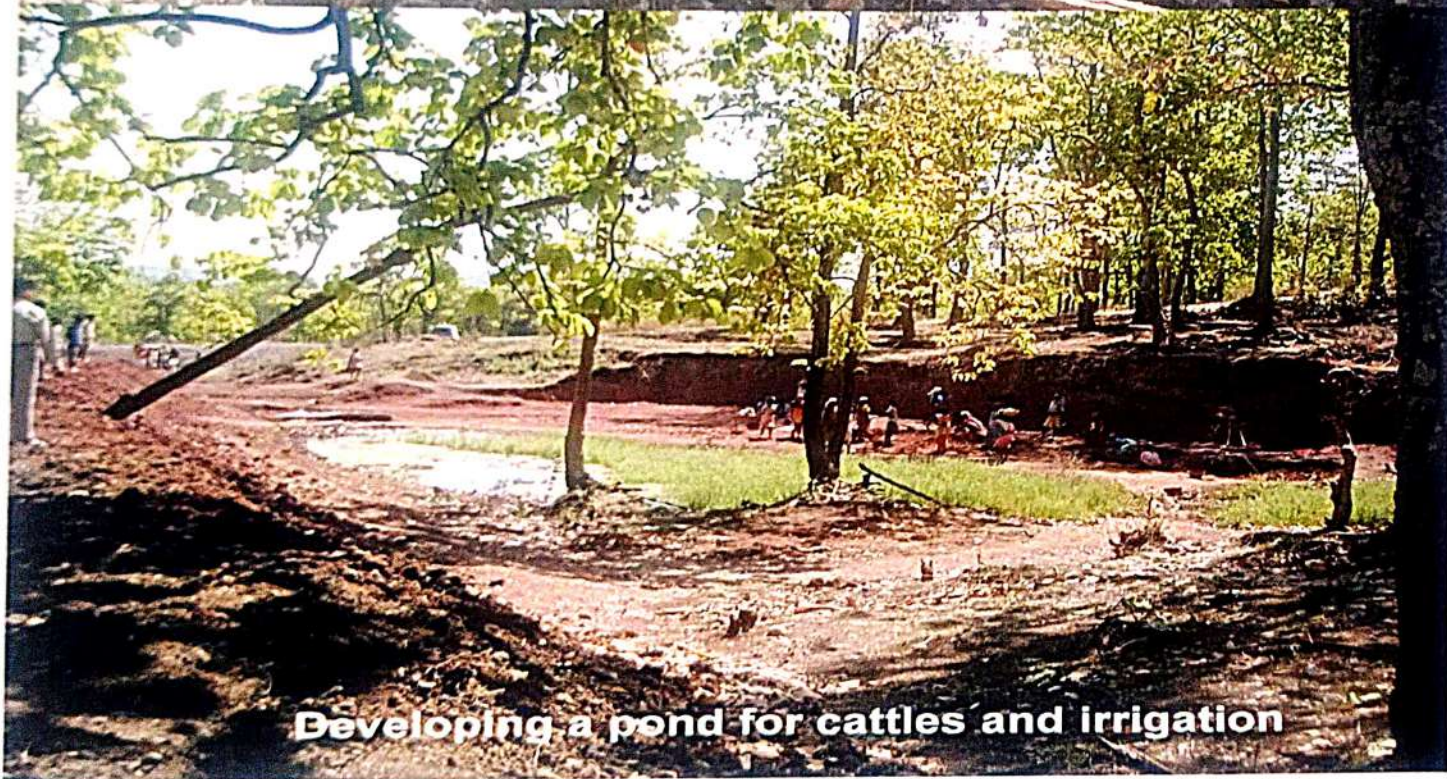

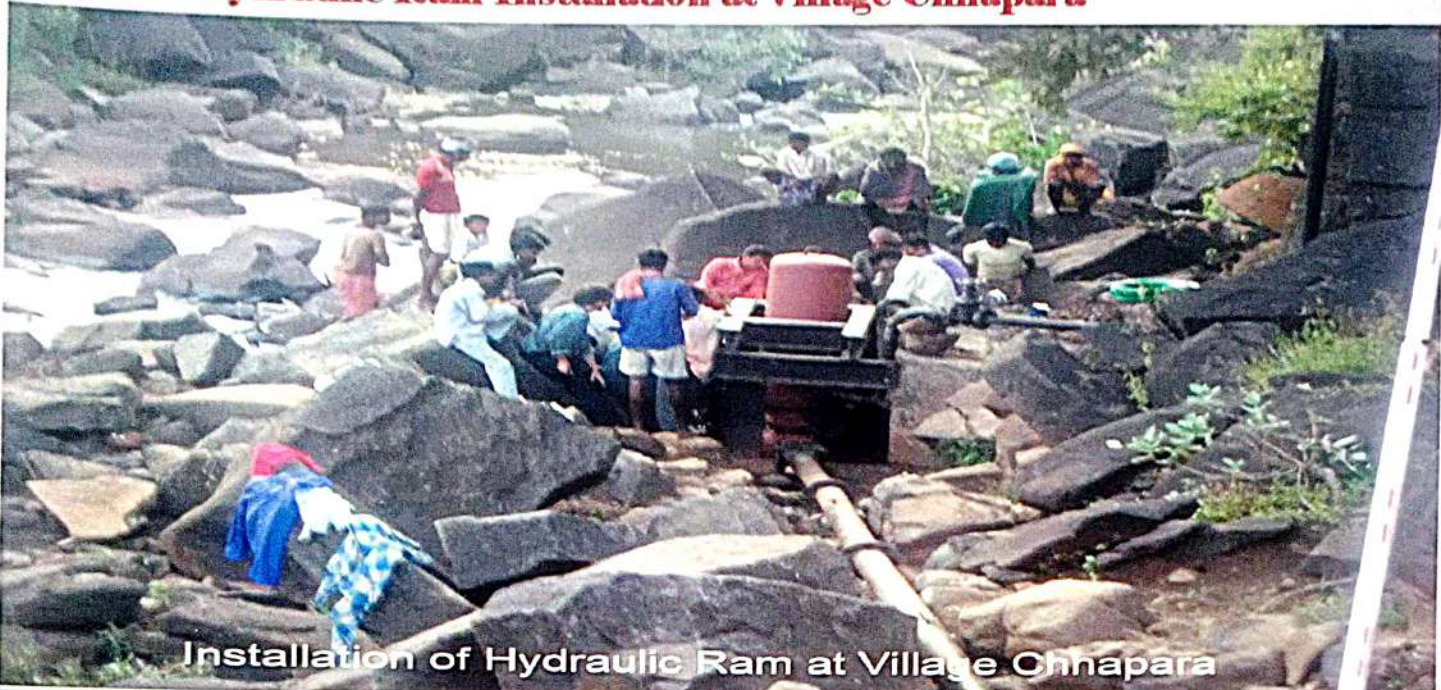

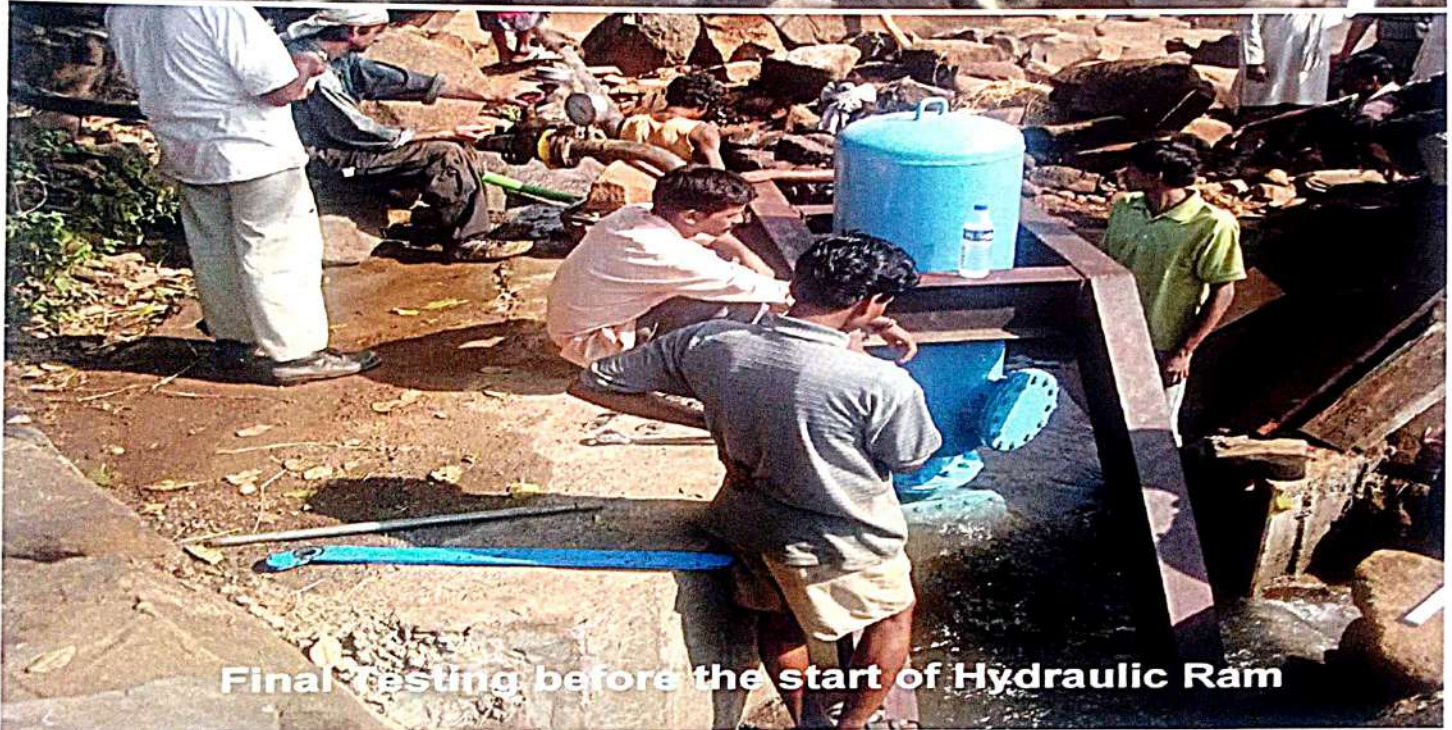

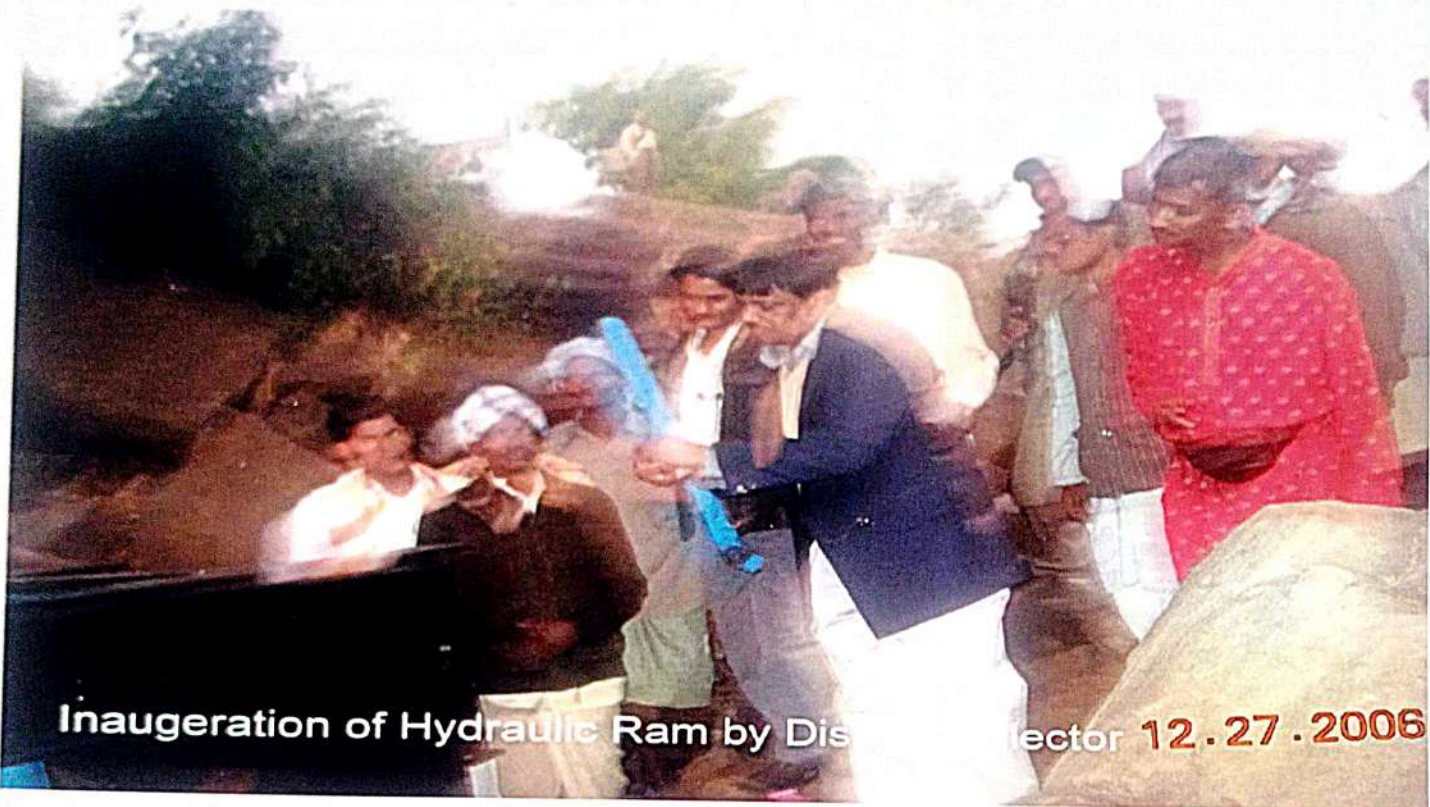

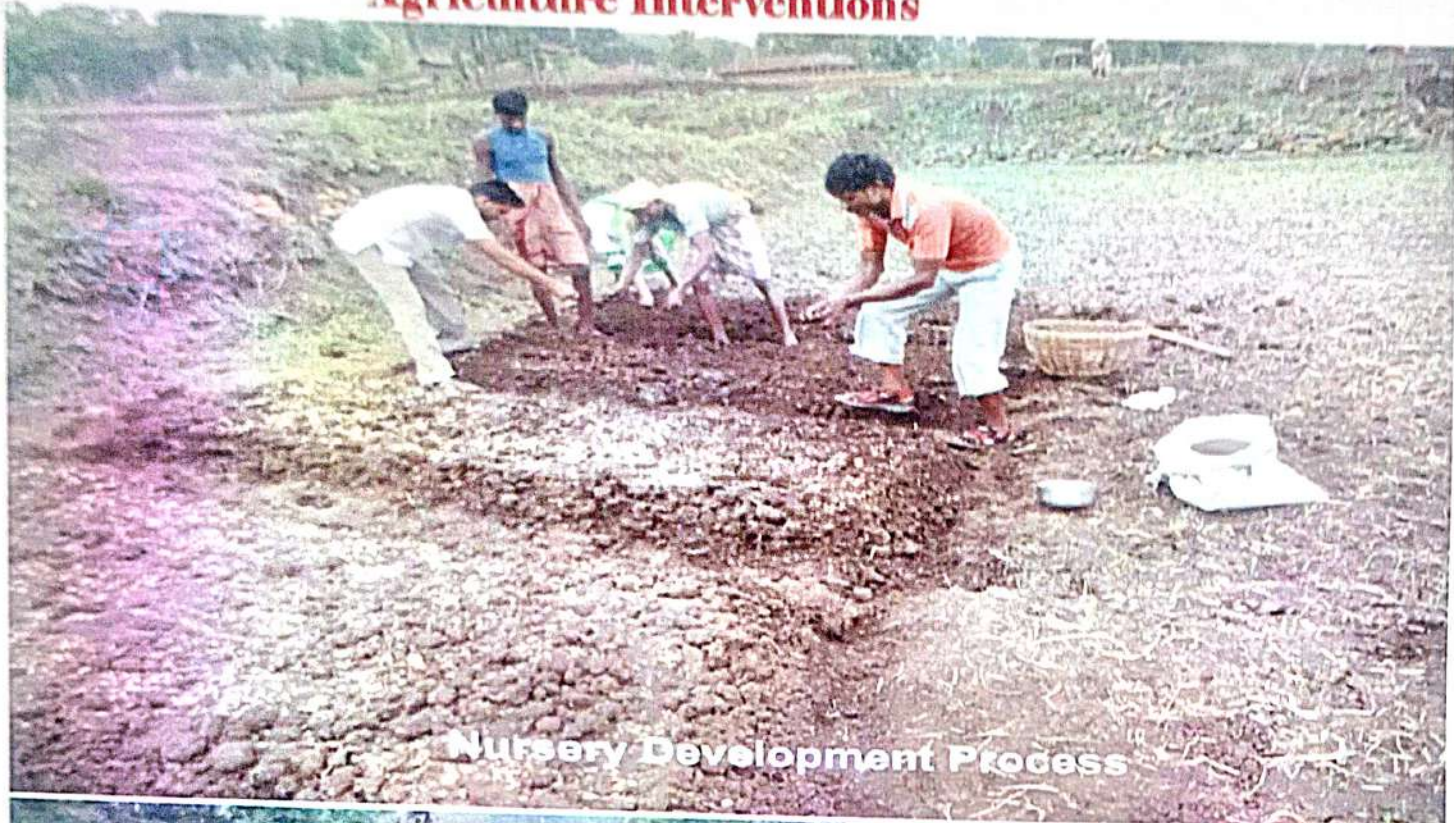

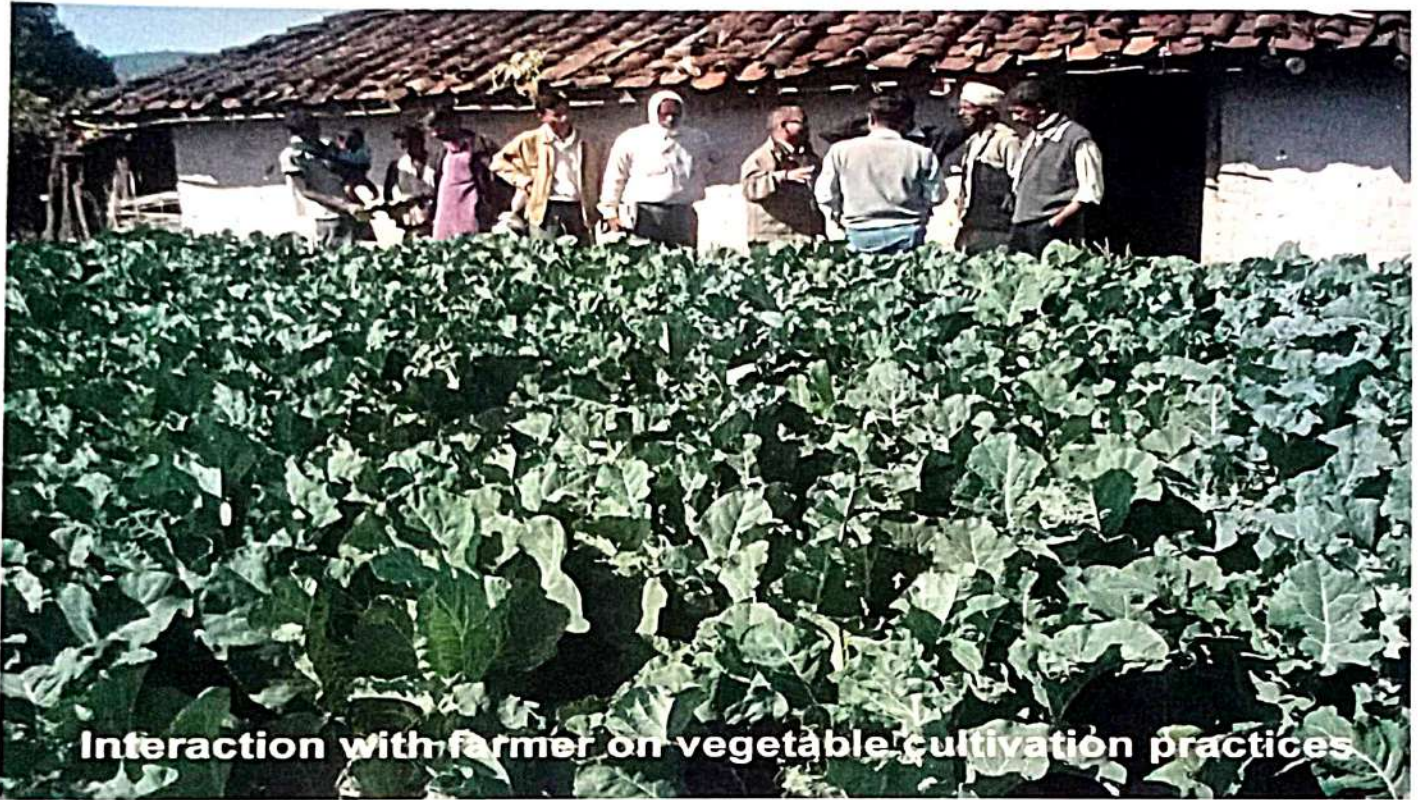

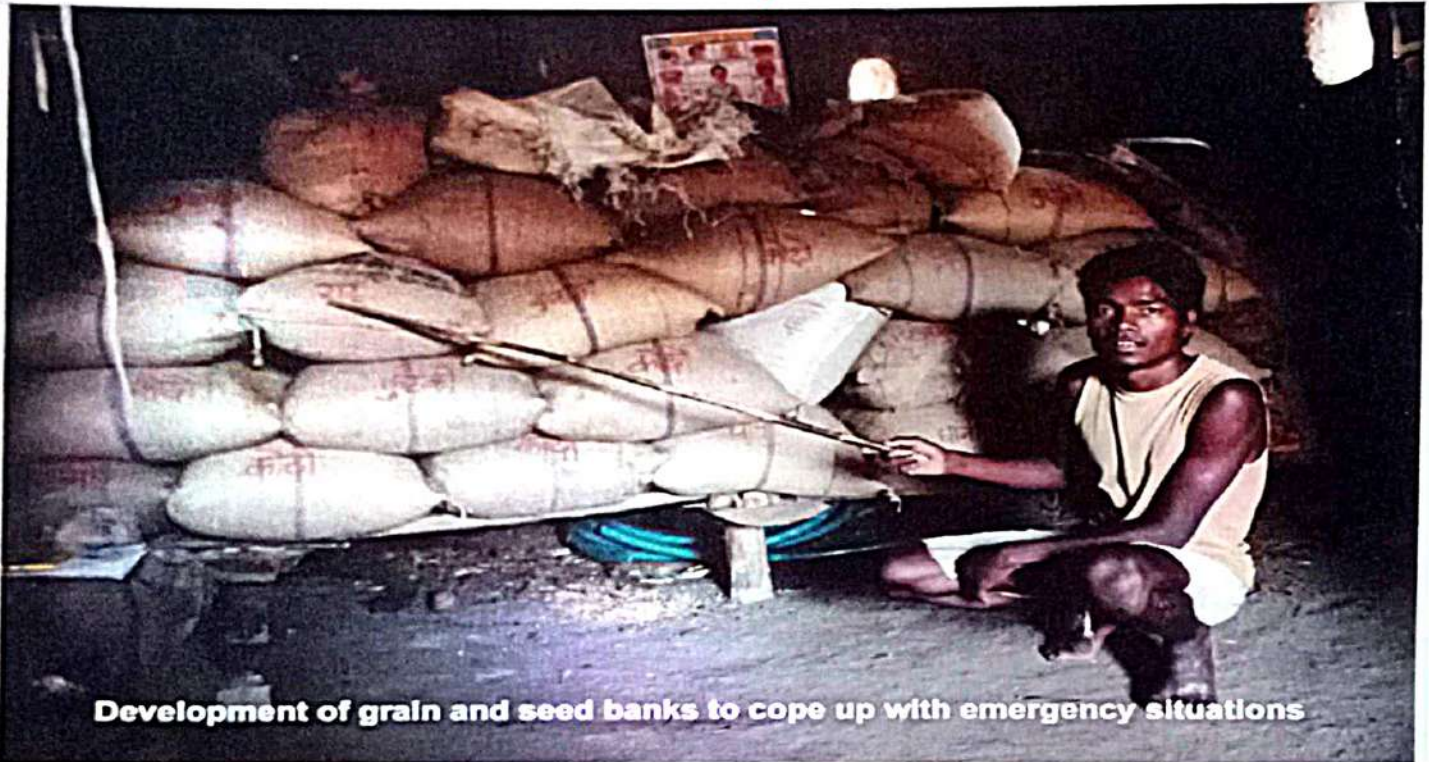

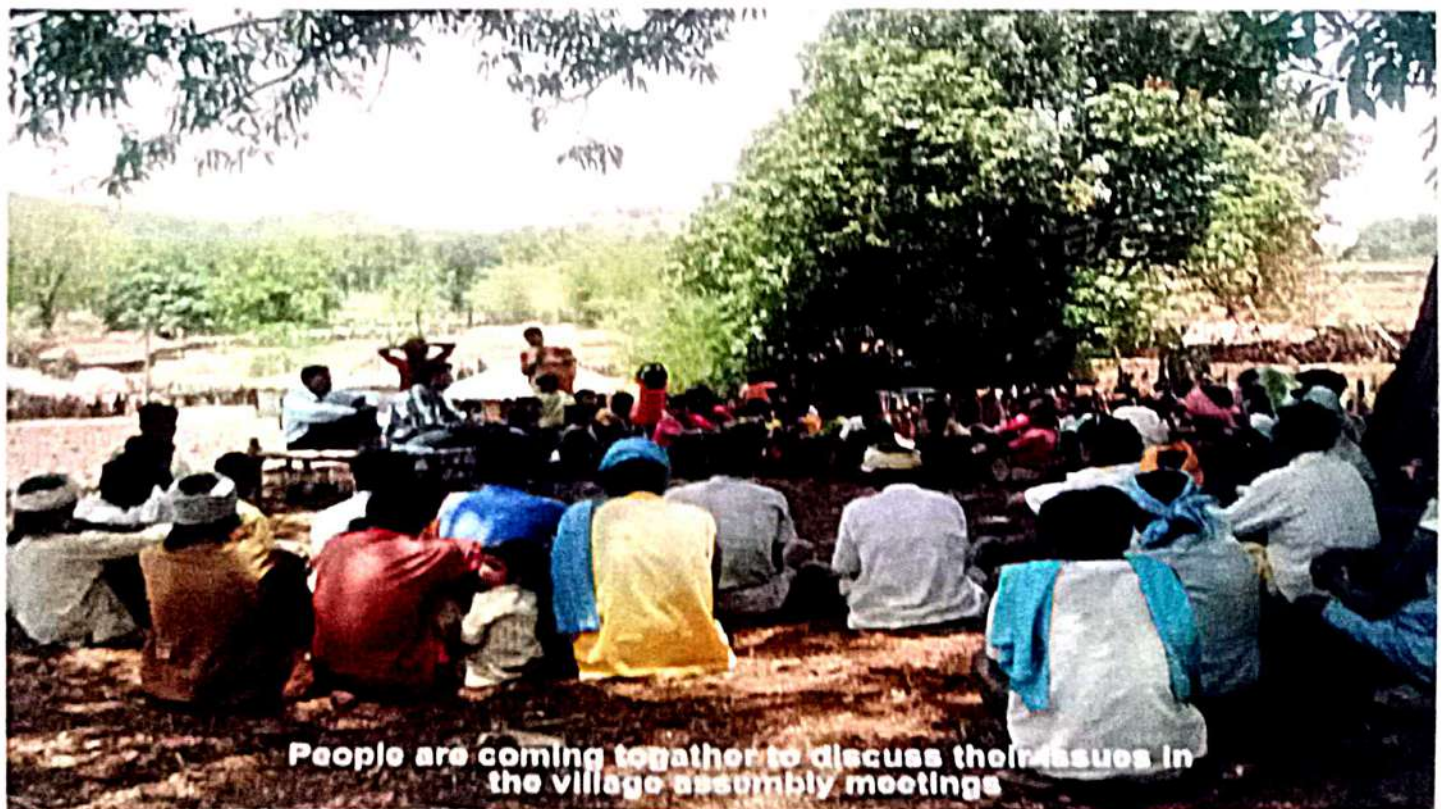

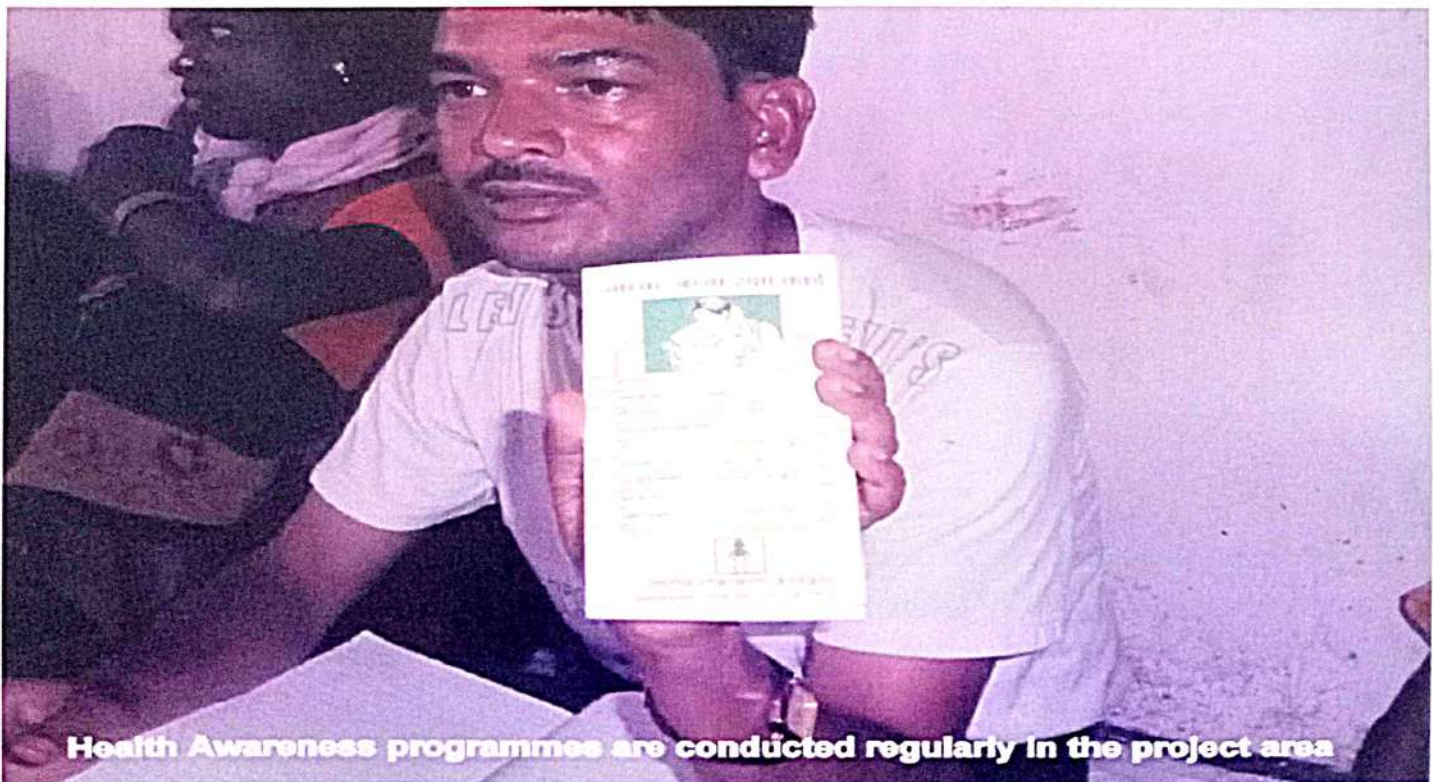
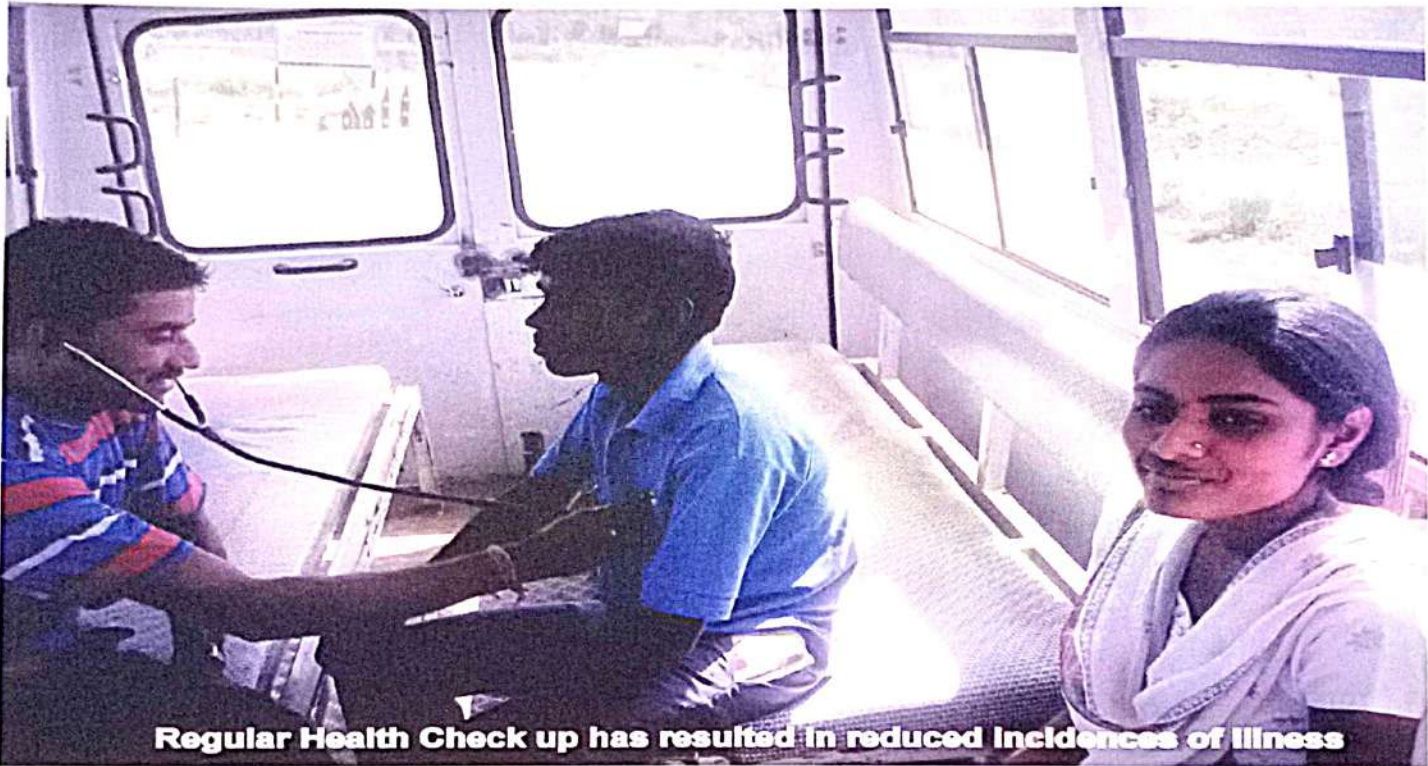

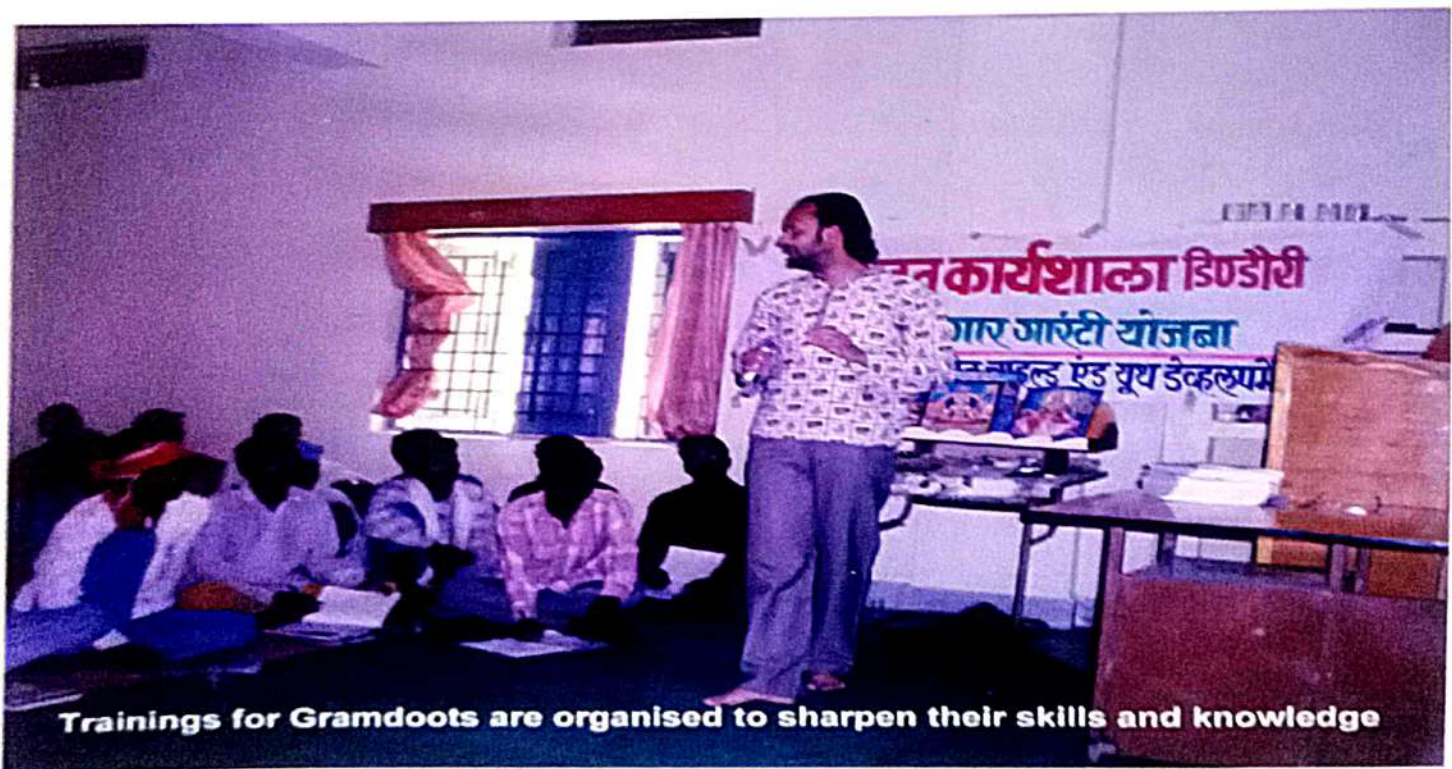

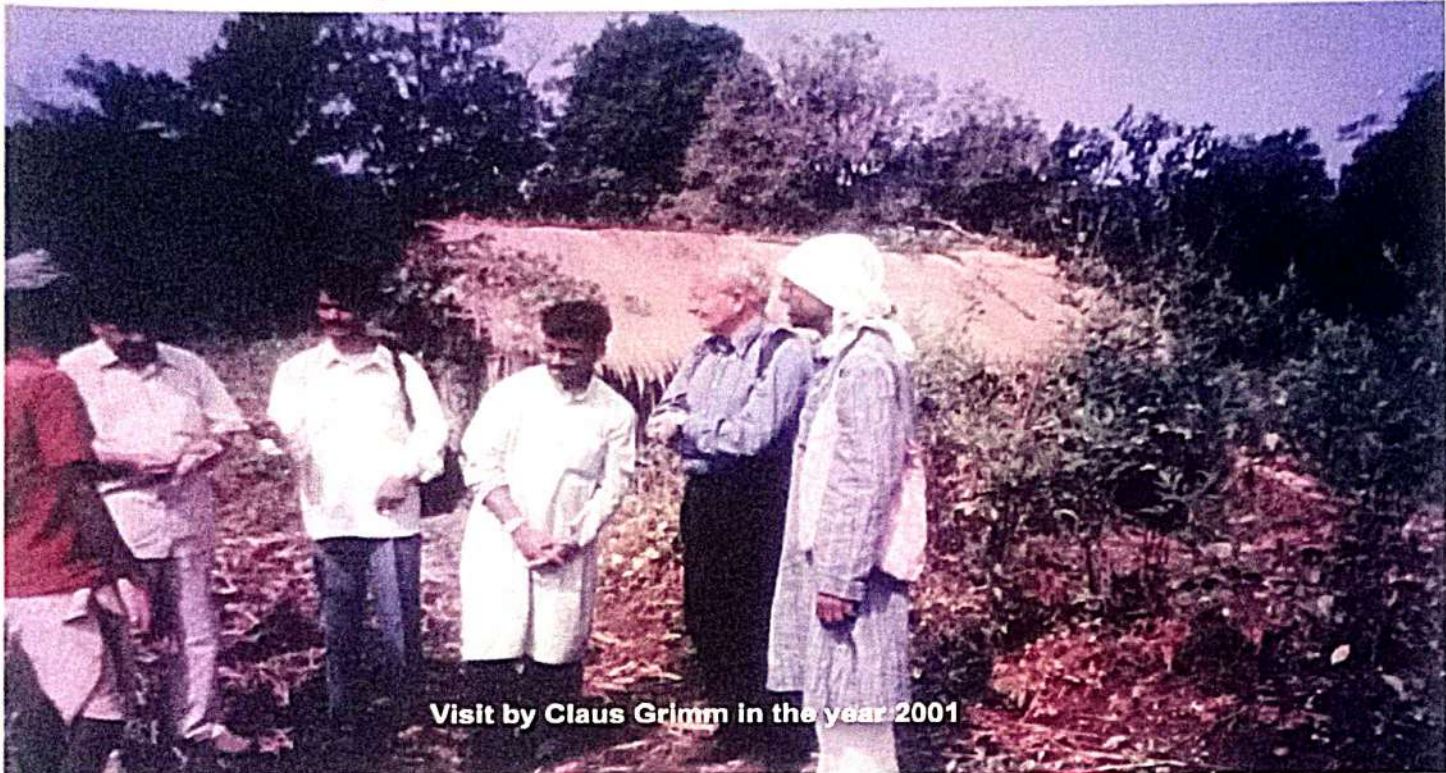

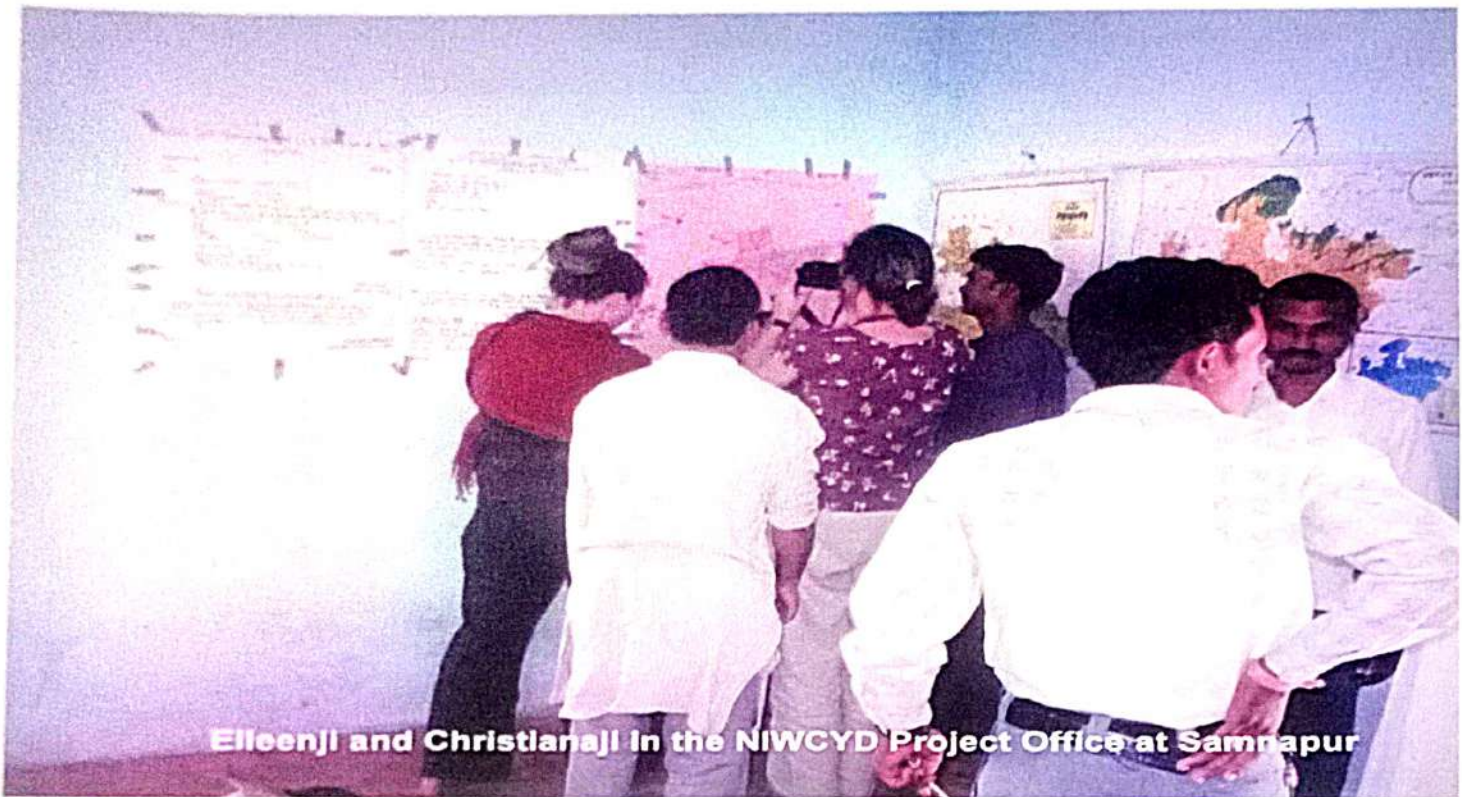

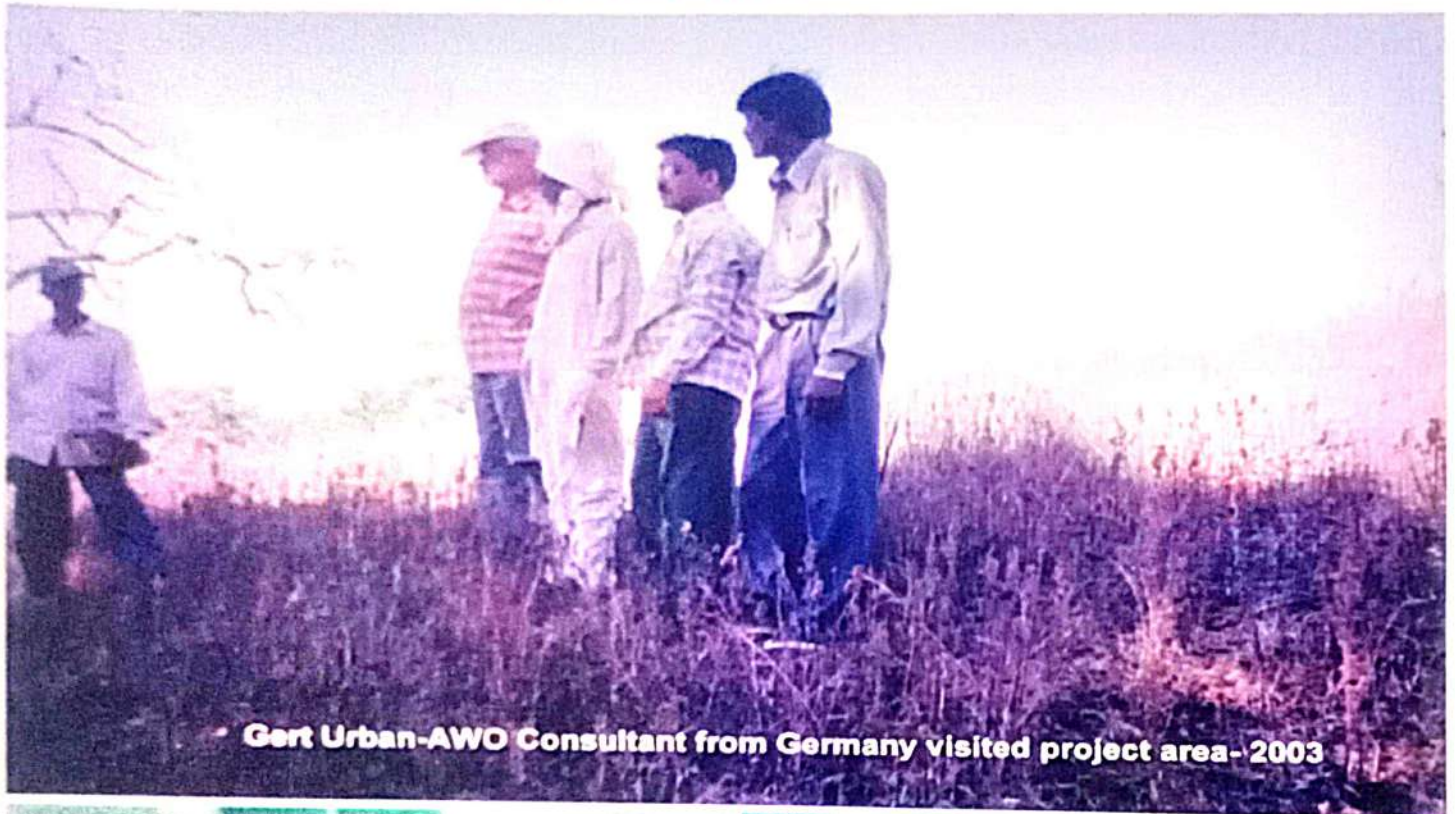
